The 2011 Fair is underway! Winners at the 4-H Horse Show Sunday evening were Katie Bailey, Paige Shafer, Kelli Holthaus, Kashli Holthaus, Dominck Tarango, Morgan Woelk, Lily Kleymann, Amber Smith, Karlyn Woelk, and Payton Walk.

Unified Greeley County budgets show a mill increase of 25.4% for GSD., with a slight decrease in the MSD budget. The MSD increase is a result of a 15 mill increase for the hospital, a 5 mill increase because of the decrease in valuation, and a 6 mill increase from other sources.

The proposed 2011-2012 budget for USD #200 shows an increase in the mill levy. The Local Option Budget (LOB) increases from 18.571 in 2010-11 to 26.235 in 2011-12. In addition, remodeling of the elementary school produced a proposed mill levy of 11.639 for the coming year. The increase in the LOB is mainly to rebuild the contingency fund and it should drop next year.

The Local Option Budget (LOB) for Greeley County Schools showed a decrease this year. The 10% LOB for the 2001-2002 year is 1.200 mills compared to 11.745 for 2000-2001. Carry-over in the 2000-2001 budget reduced the LOB mill levy for the coming year.

Those involved in the Greeley County Library's summer reading program Reading Road Trip group reached their summer goal. They read 7,120 pages and "traveled" from Kansas to California and back, through books. They made a real road trip Thursday, July 26, to Dodge City where they visited Boot Hill Museum, Ford County's Home of Stone Museum, Gunfighters Wax Museum and Wright Park. A great time was had by all!

The Junior Golf League held their year-end tourney on July 25, with 14 participants. Junior High winner was Chase Schneider, and grade school champion was Chip Schneider.

Greeley County received some scattered showers over the past week totaling 1.21 inches of rain, bringing the July total to 3.43 inches, which is above the norm of 3.10. The county is still .87 inches below the norm for the year at this point, which is 11.91 inches.
