

# Greeley County receive needed rains as wheat drilling is ready to start

Greeley County received two rains this past week. The Tribune weather station reported 0.54 inches at their Thursday, Sept. 2 reading and 0.53 inches on Saturday, Sept. 4.

The rains were not general over the county, but the National Weather Service precipitation maps showed the entire county receiving some rains. The rains were heavier in the south. The southeast sections of the county showed 1.5 - 2.0 inches and the southwest was 1.0 - 2.0 inches. The precipitation maps showed .5 - 1.5 inches in the northeast sections and .5 - 1.0 inches in the northwest.

The station has reported 1.07 inches of rain for the week and for the first 6 days

of September compared to an average for the total month of September of 1.13 inches.

The past week's rains were unusual for September.

For the year-to-date the station has received 19.90 inches of rain, which is 5.04 inches above the normal of 14.86 inches.

Alan Schlegel, agronomist at the Southwest Research Extension Center, remarked on Tuesday, Sept. 7 that the past week's rain helped a little bit for wheat planting. "The rain might have helped the milo, but the corn is pretty well done."

Alan said that he is retiring and Tuesday was his last official day at the station. Alan started at the station in 1986. "I've enjoyed my

time here. I could have done without some of the windy days."

Farmers reported that wheat drilling would begin this week. In recent years the ideal planting date has moved back, so some will wait a week or two, but the moisture is sufficient to get the wheat up now in most of the county. There are reports that the northwest portions of the county are still short of moisture and will need rain for good planting conditions.

Some farmers reported that the past week's rains really helped the milo and they even helped that corn that was 3 weeks or more away.

The high temperature for the past week at the station was 99° on Aug. 31 dropping to a high of 79° on Sept. 4. The low for the week was 52° on Sept 6.

The average soil temperatures in Greeley County for the past week were 80° on Aug 31, and Sept. 1, 79° on Sept. 2, 80° on Sept. 3, 78° on Sept. 4, 77° on Sept. 5, and 76° on Sept. 6.

The average wind speed in Greeley County for the past week was 6.0 mph with a high of 35.4 mph on Wednesday, Sept. 1.

According to the National Agriculture Statistics Service, as of Sept. 5, in the West Central District of Kansas 99% of the corn is in dough, 78% is dented, and 21% is mature.

**Kansas Crop Progress And Condition**  
MANHATTAN, Kan. September 7, 2021 - For the week ending September

5, 2021, there were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 10% very short, 30% short, 55% adequate, and 5% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 12% very short, 32% short, 53% adequate, and 3% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Corn condition rated 6% very poor, 13% poor, 27% fair, 45% good, and 9% excellent. Corn dough was 95%, near 97% last year, and equal to the five-year average. Dented was 76%, behind 81% last year, and near 80% average. Mature was 26%, near 29% last year, and behind 31% average. Harvested was 4%, equal to both last year and average.

Soybean condition rated 7% very poor, 9% poor, 27% fair, 51% good, and 6% excellent. Soybeans blooming was 96%, near 98% both last year and average. Setting pods was

86%, behind 92% both last year and average. Dropping leaves was 12%, behind 19% last year, but near 11% average.

Sorghum condition rated 3% very poor, 9% poor, 32% fair, 48% good, and 8% excellent. Sorghum headed was 97%, near 98% last year, and equal to average. Coloring was 64%, near 65% last year and 61% average. Mature was 11%, ahead of 6% last year, and near 7% average.

Cotton condition rated 1% very poor, 8% poor, 37% fair, 48% good, and 6% excellent. Cotton setting bolls was 93%, near 92% last year, and ahead of 85% average. Bolls opening was 27%, ahead of 20% last year and 15% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 6% very poor, 16% poor, 38% fair, 38% good, and 2% excellent.
