

Greeley County receives some needed rains

Greeley County received some much needed rain this past week. The Tribune weather station reported 0.21 inches of precipitation at their Monday morning, May 4 reading.

More rain was in the forecast for Monday and Monday night.

The National Weather Service Precipitation maps for Monday showed all of Greeley County receiving from .01 to .25 inches of rain.

At the end of March the Tribune weather station had recorded 2.12 inches of precipitation above normal, but for the month of April the station had received only 0.68 inches of moisture compared to a normal for the month of 1.64 inches.

As of the May 4 reading, the Tribune weather station has received 4.92 inches of precipitation for the year-to-date, which is still 0.58 inches above the normal of 4.34 inches.

Alan Schlegel, agronomist at the Southwest Research and Extension Center, said that the wheat is starting to show stress and needs rain. "The flag leaf is coming out and it is in a critical stage of development. It will help a lot if we get at least a ¼ inch of rain."

Schlegel remarked on Monday that they were 2/3 finished with planting corn at the station.

The high temperatures for the past week at the station rose from 54° on May 3 to a high of 85° on Friday, May 7 and then dropped back to 57° on Sunday. The low temperature for the week was 32° on Thursday morning, May 6.

The average soil temperatures for the past week were 58° on May 4, 60° on May 5, 59° on May 6, 61° on May 7, 63° on May 8, 64° on May 9, and 60° on May 10.

According to the National Agriculture Statistics Service, as of May 2, in the West Central District of Kansas 96% of the winter wheat was jointed and 4% was headed, 19% of the corn was planted and 2% had emerged.

Kansas Crop Progress And Condition
MANHATTAN, Kan. May 10, 2021 - For the week ending May 9, 2021, there were 5.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 6% very short, 23% short, 68% adequate, and 3% surplus. Subsoil

moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 21% short, 68% adequate, and 3% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 12% poor, 31% fair, 45% good, and 8% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 91%, near 88% last year. Headed was 28%, behind 36% last year and 46% for the five-year average.

Corn planted was 54%, near 58% last year and 55% average. Emerged was 26%, near 27% last year and 28% average.

Soybeans planted was 27%, ahead of 21% last year and 12% average. Emerged was 3%, near 5% last year and 2% average.

Sorghum planted was 3%, near 5% last year and 2% average.

Cotton planted was 13%, near 16% last year, but ahead of 5% average.

Sunflowers planted was 1%, near 2% last year, and equal to average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 3% very poor, 9% poor, 34% fair, 50% good, and 4% excellent.
