Multiple Varsity Golf meets this past week

The Greeley County High School Golf Team played three Varsity tournaments this past week.

On Tuesday at Oakley, Cade Mangan shot a 42-46-88 for 11th place. This was his second straight tournament placing 11th, just one away from a top ten medal. Freshman Kasen Felty had the next best score for the Jackrabbits with a 48-48-96, followed closely by Edwin Manzanares' 47-53-100. Edwin has really turned a corner and has been playing much better golf lately. Jaxson Brandl struggled, shooting a 55-59-114 for his worst tournament of the year. This gave us a team score of 398, which is getting us closer and closer to contention for the last spot to make it to state as a team. We will definitely need to be under 400 at regionals to have a chance.

On Thursday at Colby, Cade Mangan finally broke through with a top ten medal. He shot a 48-41-89 to place 10th at a very tough tournament. Jaxson Brandl shot his best score of the year at Colby with a 52-47-99. This was his first time breaking 100 and that is a big milestone for these kids early on in their golfing careers. Kasen Felty was next for the Jackrabbits with a 53-49-101, followed by Isaac Schneider's 61-52-113. This gave us a team score of 402 and a 7th place finish out of 11 schools. Considering Oberlin was the only other 1A school in attendance, I was pretty happy with the results.

On Friday at Johnson, the team struggled a little. I think three tournaments in four days had them a little worn out. Cade Mangan

(Three points separated the 3 place tie and 4th place!)

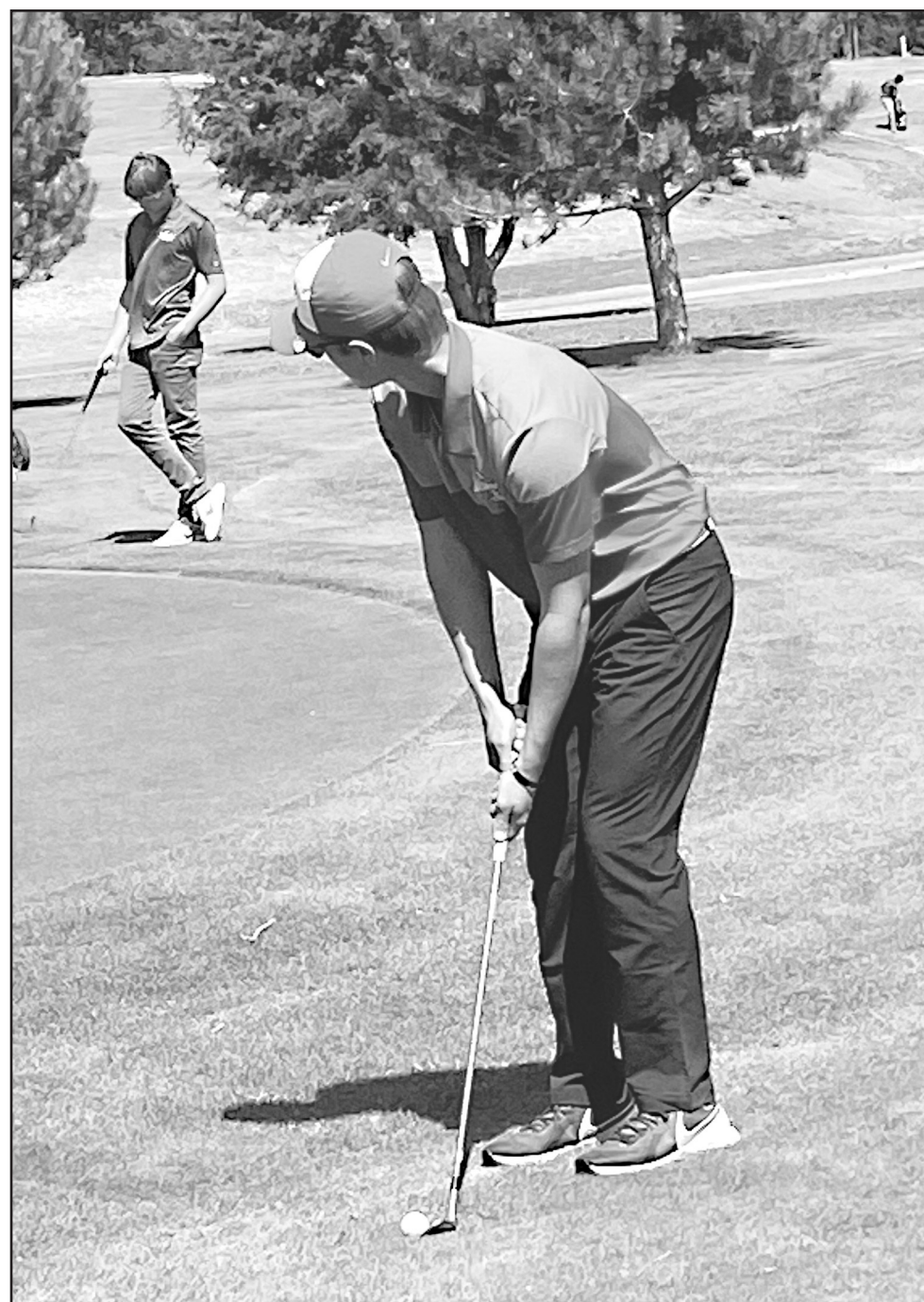
Two special awards were given by Mrs. Baber. Luke

Next week we host our home tournament on Monday, May 10th and then

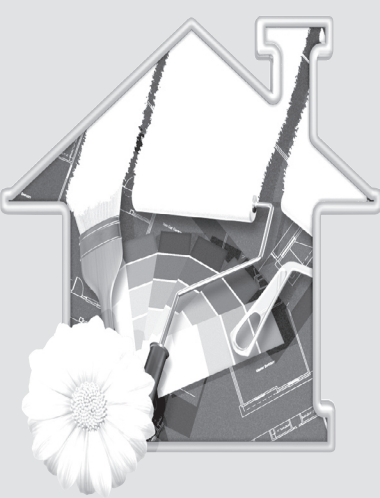
go to Sharon Springs for the League tournament on Friday, May 14th. Regionals will be Monday, May 17th at Atwood.
