## Fall harvest continued this past week in Greeley County

Alan Schlegel, agronomist at the Southwest Research Extension Center, remarked on Monday morning that they were essentially done cutting corn. "There is a late planted study that we have yet to cut.

"We have just got started cutting milo. It's a little better than I thought it would be. What we have cut so far is about average. The humidity is a little high, but we hope to be cutting this afternoon."

Dirk Schneider at CHS said, "We are still going with harvest. We are closer to being finished, but it is not done. We are waiting for some of the milo to dry. Despite the dry weather, it doesn't seem to want to dry down.

"Parts of the county that got rain had o.k. yields, but most of the county was not very good. There were not any real surprises."

The weather in Greeley County this past week remained dry. The Tribune weather station did not

report any precipitation during the past week. The station has not reported any precipitation for the first 19 days of October. The normal for the total month is 1.49 inches. For the year-to-date the station has received 14.10 inches for precipitation, which is 2.17 inches below the normal of 16.27 inches.

The last moisture at the station was 0.65 inches of rain on Sept. 9, 10, and 11.

The high temperature at the station increased from 74° on Oct. 12 to 87° on Oct. 14 and then dropped to a high of 42° on Sunday, Oct. 18. The low for the week was 29° on Friday morning, Oct. 16.

The average soil temperatures in Greeley County for the past week were 65° on Oct. 13, 64° on Oct. 14, 63° on Oct. 15, 60° on Oct. 16, 59° on Oct. 17, 60° on Oct. 18, and 56° on Oct. 19.

The average wind speed in Greeley County for the past week was 6.8 mph

with a high of 30.0 mph on Friday, Oct. 16.

According to the National Agriculture Statistics Service, as of Oct. 18 in the West Central District 89% of the wheat has been planted and 73% had emerged, 72% of the corn has been harvested.

### Kansas Crop Progress October 19, 2020 -

For the week ending October 18, 2020, there were 6.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 29% very short, 50% short, 21% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 23% very short, 46% short, 31% adequate, and 0% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 7% very poor, 17% poor, 45% fair, 28% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat planted was 84%, ahead of 73% last year and 70% for the five-year

average. Emerged was 61%, ahead of 46% both last year and average.

Corn harvested was 76%, ahead of 58% last year and 69% average.

Soybean condition rated 3% very poor, 10% poor, 32% fair, 46% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 95%, ahead of 90% last year, and near 91% average. Harvested was 64%, well ahead of 27% last year and 35% average.

Sorghum condition rated 3% very poor, 10% poor, 29% fair, 45% good, and 13% excellent. Sorghum

mature was 95%, ahead of 84% last year and 86% average. Harvested was 49%, well ahead of 24% last year, and ahead of 32% average.

Cotton condition rated 3% very poor, 12% poor, 40% fair, 40% good, and 5% excellent. Cotton bolls opening was 88%, near 89% last year, but ahead of 79% average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 11% very poor, 23% poor, 39% fair, 25% good, and 2% excellent.
