

Weather in Greeley County is warm, dry and windy

The weather this past week in Greeley county has been warm, dry and windy. The Tribune weather station did not report any precipitation during the past week. The National Weather Service precipitation reports did not show any precipitation in Greeley County for the past 7 days. The Tribune weather station reported only 0.08 inches of precipitation for the month of October.

For the year-to-date the station has received 14.18 inches of precipitation, which is 2.84 inches below the normal of 17.02 inches.

The high winds of 40 to 60 mph that were predicted for this weekend did not materialize. There were some 25 to 35 mph winds on Sunday.

The average wind speeds for the past week were 9.4 mph. The high winds for the week were 33.9 mph on Friday, Nov. 6, 37.3 mph on Saturday, and 35.1 mph on Sunday.

The high temperatures for the past week rose from 79° on Nov. 2 to highs in the low 80s for four days before falling back to a high of 74° on Sunday, Nov. 8. The low for the week was 33° on Nov. 3 and Nov. 6.

Alan Schlegel, agronomist

at the Southwest Research Extension Center, remarked on Monday morning, "We still have a little milo to cut but should be done this week. Everything is now dry."

"We had some milo yields over 100 and some of the continuous crop milo yields of 50 bushels per acre."

Dirk Schneider at CHS said on Monday morning that they were going to finish this week. "The end is getting close. We could finish by Tuesday. There was some variations, but for most of the county it wasn't very good."

The soil temperatures in Greeley County for the past week were 51° on Nov. 3, 53° on Nov. 4, 55° on Nov. 5, 56° on Nov. 6, 55° on Nov. 7, 57° on Nov. 8, and 59° on Nov. 9.

According to the National Agriculture Statistics Service, as of Nov. 1 in the West Central District 88% of the wheat has emerged, and 92% of the corn has been harvested.

November 2, 2020 - For the week ending November 8, 2020, there were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural

Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 25% very short, 41% short, 34% adequate, and 0% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 21% very short, 42% short, 37% adequate, and 0% surplus.

Field Crops Report:
 Winter wheat condition rated 7% very poor, 16% poor, 46% fair, 28% good, and 3% excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 84%, ahead of 77% last year, and near 80% for the five-year average.

Corn harvested was 94%, ahead of 88% last year, and near 92% average.

Soybeans harvested was 90%, ahead of 79% last year and 83% average.

Sorghum harvested was 85%, ahead of 80% last year and 75% average.

Cotton condition rated 6% very poor, 13% poor, 40% fair, 37% good, and 4% excellent. Cotton harvested was 31%, ahead of 24% last year and 23% average.

Sunflowers harvested was 79%, near 76% last year, and ahead of 67% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 11% very poor, 23% poor, 41% fair, 23% good, and 2% excellent.

Researchers test sorghum as option for grain-based ethanol production

Kansas State University researchers are tracking the nitrous oxide emissions associated with grain sorghum production, and its effect on the carbon intensity score – a measure of how much carbon and carbon dioxide equivalent it takes to produce a bushel of grain.

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), a United Nations body that assesses the science related to climate change, has previously reported that direct emissions from sorghum production – derived from the amount of nitrogen fertilizer that is put out – is estimated at 1%.

In this video, Peter Tomlinson, an associate professor in K-State's Department of Agronomy, explains the current progress of the university's research. "So far," he said, "the results have been very positive. What we're seeing in the

field research is that we are about .3% to .4% (direct emissions) depending on location."

The researchers say the

early results are encouraging for producers who are interested in providing sorghum for ethanol production.
